

Pet Research Project: Practice Implications

Inspiring Colorado to End Domestic Violence

- 1) Routinely incorporate questions about pets into screening/intake
  - Do you have animals?
  - Has your partner ever hurt or threatened your animal?
- 2) Safety Planning with Animals
  - Does the survivor have family or friends who can keep, watch, or help care for animals?
  - Document pet ownership (photos, vet records, adoption receipts, microchip)
  - Include animals in protection orders
  - If planning to leave, include pet items in your "go" bag (food, medications, vaccination records, favorite toy, etc.)
