Other legislative news: - SB22-100, which continues the statewide fatality review board, has been sent to the Governor! - HB22-1210, the Domestic Violence Offender Management Board Sunset bill, has passed both - We are supporting a newer bill (HB22-1356) that creates a grant program for small nonprofits to cover infrastructure and capacity building costs. It has also passed both chambers.


